1	Christian McCaffrey, CAR	He's back. #1 pick easy.		
2	Dalvin Cook, MIN	Some injury concern but nothing to push out of the 2 spot.		
3	Alvin Kamara, NO	His track history of big games puts him at #3 without much competition.		

4	Ezekiel Elliott, DAL	There's concern after last year, I get it, but if Dak is back, Zeke should return to form. Still not a big buyer.
5	Austin Ekeler, LAC	If healthy, he's going to have a special season.
6	Derrick Henry, TEN	He's the King, but after a 2,000 yard season with 378 carries, many are expecting serious regression. Historically nobody comes close but he's built different.
7	Jonathan Taylor, IND	Might start slow due to the schedule, but #2 easiest schedule weeks 6-10, top 12 schedule weeks 11-15, and Top 10 for the playoffs. With Wentz healthy, he should feast.
8	Najee Harris, PIT	All of the backs in this tier are excellent choices for a RB-RB start, which I'm personally a fan of this season. I want two of these guys on my team. Najee should take the league by storm in his rookie season and I'm comfortable taking him here ahead of Chubb.
9	Nick Chubb, CLE	Should get out to a fast start with the #1 easiest schedule for RBs weeks 1-5. Should make a serious run at rushing yards leader in 2021.
10	Antonio Gibson, WAS	Great upside and will be used as a receiver to take advantage of much slower corners and safeties. O-line should be better and no real threats to opportunity on the roster.
11	Aaron Jones, GB	Not a big target for me this season but definitely capable of being your RB1 if you take Adams, Hill or Diggs in Round one.
12	Joe Mixon, CIN	Top 10 schedule and the offensive line has finally started trending up with Frank Pollack. He'll be given a huge workload and with Burrow back and a better threat in the passing game, Mixon fantasy points should return.
13	Clyde Edwards-Helaire, KC	Ankle sprain appears minor so draft accordingly. Finished RB22 last season, but the Chiefs improved the offensive line with little competition behind him.
14	Saquon Barkley, NYG	There's just too much risk and typically after an ACL injury it takes a year to get back to full strength. Pass and let him be somebody else's problem each week. He'll have his share of solid games for sure.

16	Chris Carson, SEA	
17	James Robinson, JAC	Back in line for serious carries with the Etienne injury.
18	D'Andre Swift, DET	Struggling with a groin injury and reports of missing week one appear to be overblown. His practice last week should put all doubts at ease. Preseason worriers. I would have 14 if not for the concern or reaggravation.
19	Mike Davis, ATL	Bell cow season coming up for Davis.
20	Miles Sanders, PHI	Looks like the RB position in Philly will be all about rotation. Sanders can still make the big plays, but his workload will be limited in 2021.
21	Josh Jacobs, LV	Concerns about Drake stealing opportunity are overblown as Drake hasn't been the picture of health. The offensive line plummets Jacobs stock but 5th round is a price I'd be willing to pay if I need an RB2.

23	Javonte Williams, DEN	Huge upside for the second half the season. Compare this situation to the Ravens drafting Dobbins with Ingram holding the fort down early. Denver has a Top 10 schedule regular season and a Top 5 schedule for the playoffs. Swing for the fences pick!

26	Damien Harris, NE	They're going to lean on Harris more than we originally thought now that Cam is gone and Mac is the starter.
27	Trey Sermon, SF	Cupcake schedule (Top 5) for both Preseason and playoffs. Talent + Opportunity + Pedigree = big season for Sermon, especially if injury occurs to Mostert who's already dealing with a back issue.
